Areas of focus

- Shift the understanding of education closer to a human right that the State has an obligation to promote and protect;
- Holistic approach to examining, monitoring and promoting the right to education, including the financing, establishment and operation of free compulsory education, the fight against all forms of exclusion and discrimination, and efforts to boost the quality of rights-based education;
- Promote assistance to Governments to secure the progressive implementation of the principle of compulsory primary education free of charge for all;
- Develop dialogue and cooperation with relevant United Nations (UN) bodies and agencies, such as the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation;
- The legal framework includes the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights*, the *International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights* and the *Convention on the Rights of the Child*.
