#### Special Rapporteur on the right to food

**Current mandate holder:** Jean Ziegler

**Term of mandate holder:** 2000-2006

#### Areas of focus

- Seek and respond to information relating to the right to food while identifying related emerging issues;
- Cooperate with Governments, international organisations and non-governmental organisations on the promotion and effective implementation of the right to food;
- Focus special attention to the issue of drinking water;
- The legal framework includes the *International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights*, the *Universal Declaration on the Eradication of Hunger and Malnutrition*, the *Rome Declaration on World Food Security* and the *Voluntary Guidelines to Support the Progressive Realization of the Right to Adequate Food in the Context of National Food Security*;
- The right to food is defined as the right to have regular, permanent and unrestricted access, either directly or by means of financial purchases, to quantitatively and qualitatively adequate and sufficient food corresponding to the cultural traditions of people, and which ensures a physical and mental, individual and collective, fulfilling and dignified life free of fear.
